Indigenous Focused Graduation Requirement

As part of the Province of BC's commitments to truth, reconciliation, and anti-racism, the Ministry will be implementing an Indigenous-focused grad requirement for students graduating on or after 2023/24.

Letter from Minster of Education on Indigenous-focused Graduation Requirement

Dear Education Superintendents and Partners:

In follow up to this year's National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, I would like to acknowledge the important work you are doing to move forward reconciliation within British Columbia's K-12 education system, including preparing for the implementation of the new Indigenous-focused graduation requirement in the 2023/24 school year.

To assist you in these efforts, the Ministry of Education and Child Care and the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) have co-developed a <u>brochure</u> and <u>video resources</u> to support your conversations with students, parents/caregivers, and colleagues regarding the new graduation requirement. The Ministry is also working with FNESC, the BC School Superintendents Association, and the Federation of Independent School Associations in BC to offer regional workshops for educators regarding the provincial Indigenous-focused courses that meet the new requirement. More information on these workshops, including a <u>schedule for the current school year</u>, was shared with school districts and authorities via the Deputy Minister's Bulletins in October.

The new graduation requirement presents an important opportunity for schools and school districts to strengthen their relationships with local First Nations and Indigenous members of their school communities and take concrete action towards lasting and meaningful reconciliation. Again, I would like to thank you for all your hard work and dedication to the success of this initiative, which will benefit many generations of British Columbians to come. Rachna Singh Minister The proposed model for the new requirement would allow secondary school students to meet this graduation requirement through a variety of existing and new course options.

The proposed change to the graduation program would require students to complete 4 credits of Indigenous-focused coursework in order to graduate.

Step 2: Students attend Course Planning Information Session with their counsellor in Mid February. Exact dates and times for these sessions will be published at a later date.

Step 3: Students submit their "Course Request Paper Form" before March 10th. Submit this to the Counselling Office.

Step 4: Students digitally input their course requests into MyEducation BC before March 10th. Step by step instructions will be provided.

Step 5: Once due date has passed, students will not be able to input their course requests into MyEducation BC. Therefore, it is extremely important that students be proactive and do this before Spring Break

Graduation Dogwood Diploma

Students need:

80 CREDITS

- 3 Graduation Assessments Written (4 if student is in French Immersion)
- Students require a minimum of 80 credits (52 + 28) to graduate. Students begin earning credits in Grade 10 → Courses are worth 4 credits each
 - Of these 80 credits for graduation:
 - 52 are required course credits (13 courses), which includes the 4 credits of Indigenous-focused graduation requirement and
 - 28 are elective course credits (7 courses or more)
 - For French Immersion Students, there are 64 required credits to allow for the French language courses and 16 elective credits (total 80 credits)
- For all students (English and French programs), at least 16 credits (4 courses) must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required English Language Arts 12 and Career Life Connections 12
- In addition to 80 credits, students must write Provincial Graduation Assessments: Literacy 10, Numeracy 10, Literacy 12; French Imm. students write an additional assessment: Littératie 12

French Immersion Program: 64 required course credits (16 courses):

These include courses from the above subject areas and Français Langue Seconde 10, 11 and 12



French Immersion/Dual Dogwood

- French Immersion students can earn both a BC Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and a Diplôme de fin d'études secondaires en Colombie-Britannique
 - FI students have 12 more required credits (for their French courses) for a total of **64** required credits and so require 16 elective credits (4 courses), for the same total of 80 required credits
 - FI students write one additional graduation assessment for French, "Littératie 12"


