Update from White Hatter

As you may be aware, online sextortion has become a clear and present threat to teens. From January 2020 to December 2022, we have assisted 129 teens under the age of 18yrs who have been targeted by a sexualized troll and extorted for money or more pictures/video. In most cases, the sextortion began within 40 minutes of initial contact with the targeted vouth online.

We believe it is so important for youth, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity, and their parents to beware of the tactic and strategies being used in these cases. That is why we are offering this free informational video on this topic to you and your community of parents.
