In October, we pause to give thanks and gratitude for all that we have. As I reflect on the month of October, I am so thankful for this incredible FRMS community. It was wonderful to have had the opportunity to meet many of you on October 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> for our Student-Led Conferences. Student Leadership completed their first fundraiser of the year for Grade 8 Year End Activities. Thank you to Sheryl Laine and Candy Alley for their support of the fundraiser. We will also do our first Spirit Days on October 31<sup>st</sup> where we invite our students to wear their costumes to school for our Halloween activities and then follow with a PJ day on November 1<sup>st</sup>.

At FRMS, we are well underway on our technology journey. We must teach our students the skills and competencies that are required for them to be successful in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The intention of the presentations is to support our students in staying safe online and safely navigation online applications and social media. #### Halloween Costume Guidelines

- Students in costume at school should be easily recognizable. No full-face masks permitted.
- No replica weapons (guns, knives, etc) are allowed on school property
- We celebrate diversity and inclusion in New Westminster schools. Costumes that are offensive or in poor taste are not permitted ... when selecting a costume, please consider whether it violates rights or appropriates identity, based on rights maintained under the Canadian Human Rights Act: race, ethnicity, religion, age, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, genetic characteristics, or disabilities.
- School codes of conduct must always be followed. This means acting respectfully to peers and staff and maintaining good care of school property.
- Vandalism is never acceptable and is a crime.
- The possession or use of firecrackers or fireworks at school is strictly and always prohibited.
