## **Transportation** Recently PAC Chair visited MLA Aman Singh's office to ask about the status of the busing promise for Queensborough students. They missed speaking with MLA Singh directly, but was able to speak with Constituency Assistant, Sherrill Gullickson who shared the following information: MLA Singh has secured a private busing company to provide service from Queensborough to **NWSS** The provincial finance department has decided that since there hasn't recently been a public call for this busing service, that they don't see the need and won't provide the funding for the private bus service if there is a public call for this service, they will provide the funding and the program is a go a public call means: individual letters and emails from parents (and students!) asking for this busing service letters and emails should be sent to

Sherrill.Gulli ckson@leg.b c.ca There is a need for this service, and right now it is challenging for students to get from QB to NWSS safely and on time. If they were to receive letters from FRMS parents whose children live in the West End, it would show that providing a second bus under the same busing arrangement with the private company would be of enormous value.
